To pursue an aggressive interior attack, a firefighter must be able to read the environment and use benchmarks and quantifiable knowledge to determine the best course of action. This class teaches the skills, skill-sets, the context of skill application, and a methodology with regard to fire attack and hand line management. The class answers the “whys”, not just the “what’s”, and quickly creates a system that can be adapted to fit any engine company. The goal of “The Nozzle Forward” is to help craft more efficient engine companies by increasing the individuals’ competency with their tools and expanding on the conceptual aspects of the fire environment. The class will integrate the three major components of engine company work; fire behavior, hose management, and fire attack. The 22-hour class begins with a lecture on the morning of day one followed by intense hands on Engine Company training. It is a program designed to help the nozzle team make the right choice and be able to accomplish whatever task is necessary for a successful interior attack. Now let’s go do good work...
